Mighty Moses Answer Key

1. What did Pharaoh order to keep the Israelites from growing?
Kill all baby boys
2. How old was Moses when he was put in a basket? **3 months**
3. Who watched Moses? **Miriam, his sister**
4. Who found the baby in the basket? **Pharaoh's daughter**
5. What book tells about baby Moses? **Exodus**
6. Where did Moses go after he grew up? **Midian**





Instructions

1. Print all pages onto letter size white card stock.
2. Cut out cover image and answer key along the lines.
3. Glue answer key to the **back** of the cover image **before** laminating it.
 - I recommend Elmer's Rubber Cement because it is acid free.
 - Let it dry completely before laminating.
4. Laminate everything including double-sided cover and answer key for long-term durability. Instead of laminating, you may use clear Contact paper.
5. Cut out doors and blood.
6. Trim the edges of the cover page.
7. I recommend the use of 3/8" Velcro Dots instead of magnets. They are self-sticking and will last a very long time on laminated items. Notice that half of the Velcro Dots are clear, and half are white.
 - Remove one clear 3/8" Velcro Dot.
 - Attach the CLEAR DOT to the top of the door frame.
 - Place each one in roughly the same place for uniformity.
 - The white Velcro Dot will be used on the back of the blood swipe where will not be noticeable.
8. Place the matching white Velcro Dot onto the clear dot with the Velcro sides touching each other.
9. Before adhering the blood swipe to the Dot, adjust its placement on the doorpost.
 - Place the back of the blood swipe on the sticky side of the Velcro Tab.
 - Attach all blood to the doors in the same way for uniformity.
10. Place everything in a 3-ring binder pencil pouch that has a clear plastic window.
They are now ready for many years of use.
